



tromp through the woods, crawl through mud, climb over 10' walls, carry heavy gear sometimes in the freezing cold and call it "fun." There is nothing like a JROTC Raider competition!

FEMALE DIVISION: For the last two years the champion was determined by a tie-breaker between Adairsville HS and Sarasota MA and for both of those years Sarasota MA lost the tie and came in second place. Evidently these young ladies were tired of getting so close and losing by a hair so they came ready to kick butt and take names! The Black Knight ladies placed first in every event except Rope Bridge, where they came in fourth, separating them from Runner Up Adairsville HS Lady Tigers by a full 7 placement points. Close on the heels of these two powerhouses were both Georgia Military College Prep and Francis Lewis HS which came in 3rd and 4th overall respectively by placing in every team event. If Sarasota relaxes even just a little, 2016 could see four teams in the hunt for the overall championship.

MIXED DIVISION: Mixed teams must have at least four females competing in every event and these male/female teams are fierce competitors. Georgia Military College Prep was the only team that placed in the top five in all five team events (2nd PTT, CCR, and Kope Bridge; 3rd Gauntlet; 4th 5K Run) putting the Junk Yard Dogs firmly in the top spot to take home the championship. Trailing close behind were the Tigers from Waynesville Career Center who fought hard and earned the Runner Up title by placing first in CCR, second in the 5K Run, third in PTT and fifth in Gauntlet. Smith Cotton HS Tiger Team came ready to defend their multi-year title but this year, they just didn't have the overall consistency and fell short landing in third place overall with only two trophy placements (3rd 5K Run, 4th Rope Bridge).

MALE DIVISION: With 36 teams fighting for bragging rights in this insanely competitive division, only 9 schools were able to trophy in at least one of the five team events and the only way to receive top honors is to be strong in every event. Riverside Military Academy was able to hold onto their championship title again this year by placing first in PTT, 5K Run, CCR, and Rope Bridge and second in Gauntlet. With placements like this, they were unreachable! Two other teams, Sarasota MA and Adairsville HS fought hard for the Runner Up spot and although Adairsville trophied in all events (2nd 5K Run, 3rd PTT, 4th CČR, 5th Gauntlet and Rope Bridge) and Sarasota only placed in four (2nd PTT, CCR, and Rope Bridge, 3rd Gauntlet) Sarasota was able to edge out Adairsville for the second spot overall by four placement points.

Each year on Sunday morning just prior to the Awards Ceremony cadets line up to participate in the Ultimate Raider competition. One male and one female from each school run a 1.5 mile course that contains multiple obstacles that challenge the cadets on many levels. The fastest male cadet was Cadet Poteet from Island Coast High School and the fastest female was Cadet Zhou from Francis Lewis High School. This All-Service Challenge Championships event was created to lead the way in showcasing the finest, most hard-working all-service JROTC Raider teams in the nation. This single-day championship event is an off-shoot of the wildly popular Army JROTC Raider Service Championships which was held the next day. The all-service event is open to all high school raider teams. The Gerald Lawhorn Scouting Base in Molena, Georgia is an ideal location for the Raider event.

Twenty-four teams competed in the first annual event held in November 2015. These cadets competed in either the Male or Mixed division (a female division will be added in the future based on interest) in four events: Physical Team Test, 5K Run, Gauntlet, and Rope Bridge.

MIXED DIVISION

In the Mixed Division, trophies were claimed by eight different schools with the bulk of the hardware going to **Sarasota MA** (USA) and **White County HS** (USA). These two teams fought for top honors but the Black Knights from Sarasota reigned supreme capturing first in PTT and Gauntlet and second in the 5K Run and Rope Bridge making them our first ever Champion in the mixed division. White County Warriors were not far behind taking home first in Rope Bridge, second in Gauntlet and third in PTT and the 5K Run giving them the Runner Up title.

Other finishes included **Smith Cotton** (USA) 1st-5K Run, 4th-PTT, 4th-Gauntlet, 4th-Rope Bridge; **Tom C. Clark** (USAF) 2nd-PTT, 3rd-Gauntlet, 4th-5K Run; **Jeffersontown** (USMC) 5th-5K Run, 5th-Gauntlet; **Hendersonville** (USMC) 3rd-Rope Bridge; **Cedar Shoals** (USA) 5th-Rope Bridge; **Monroe Area** (USAF) 5th-PTT.

MALE DIVISION

The Male Division tends to be a true dogfight and this year was comprised almost exclusively of Army JROTC units although Hendersonville and Jeffersontown Marine Corps units did join the hunt. As the event grows, we expect a much more diverse field of competitors.

Riverside MA (USA) from Gainesville, GA dominated the field leaving all others in the dust. The Devils took home first place in all four events guaranteeing them the Championship title.

The Runner Up slot was a closer race between **Grissom** (USA) and **Georgia Military College Prep** (USA). The Males from Grissom placed in all four events (2nd-5K Run, 2nd-Gauntlet, 5th-PTT, 5th-Rope Bridge) which gave them the edge over GMC which only placed in three (2nd-Rope Bridge, 4th-PTT, 4th-5K Run).

Other finishes included: **Hendersonville** (USMC) 2nd-PTT, 3rd-Rope Bridge; **Fairview** (USA) 3rd-PTT, 4th-Gauntlet; **Ozark** (USA) 3rd-Gauntlet, 5th-5K Run; **Fort Hamilton** (USA) 3rd-5K Run; **Elbert County** (USA) 4th-Rope Bridge; **Jeffersontown** (USMC) 5th-Gauntlet.

U.S. Army Cadet Command JROTC Sational Drill Championships



1,800 Army JROTC cadets descend on Louisville to fight for top honors at the Army Nationals

Who knew that the Army Nationals could get even bigger, but this year it did! 70 schools attended with 91 teams competing from 26 different states and the competition on the drill floor was better than it had ever been. Well over 3,000 cadets, instructors and spectators descended on the venerable Kentucky International Convention Center in downtown Louisville to showcase the best of Army JROTC drill and what a day it was!

ARMED DIVISION

Consistency and strength in all of the events is the key when trying to reach for the Army Nationals Championship title, but with a competition field of 44 teams, it is near impossible to stay at the top in all events. This year three teams did place in three out of the four events and only 26 points out of 4000 separated the top two finishers. **Grant HS** from Dry Prong, Louisiana who had to settle for Runner Up last year came back stronger and placed first in both Regulation and Color Guard and second in Inspection. Their 11th place finish in Exhibition was still high enough to earn them top honors this year.

North Miami Beach Sr. HS from Florida stayed very close on Grant's heels and placed first in Exhibition, second in Regulation and fourth in Color Guard, only their middle-of-the-pack finish in Inspection kept them one step away from taking home the title.

The only other team earning top-five placements in three events was last year's champion, **Marmion Academy** from Aurora, Illinois. The Flannigan Rifles earned first in Inspection, third in Exhibition, and fifth in Regulation. These three schools better watch their backs as several returning schools with rifles at the ready have pledged to unseat them.

UNARMED DIVISION

If you were watching the awards ceremony and keeping track of the trophies awarded, there would be no way to even guess which team would end up with the overall unarmed championship title. The only team that placed in three of the four events was **Sam Rayburn HS** from Pasadena, Texas (2nd Inspection, 2nd Regulation, 4th Color Guard) but even with these high placements, they ended in third place overall after a disappointing showing in the exhibition event.

The top two schools only received two trophies each but the two events they didn't trophy in were still strong finishes, keeping them at the top of the pack. Theodore Roosevelt HS from San Antonio, Texas placed first in both Inspection and Exhibition. The Riderettes were able to gain the Championship title and stay 75 points ahead of the Tigers from Smith Cotton HS (Sedalia, Missouri). The Tigers placed third in Color Guard and fifth in Inspection and were the only ones able to place in the top ten in all four events.

Almost immediately after the 2016 Army Nationals, the KICC facility downtown began demolition and remodeling. The fantastic people at the Louisville Convention & Visitors Bureau sprang into action as their support of this event since its inception has been unwavering! The 2017 Army Nationals were given scheduling priority at the beautiful meeting rooms in the South Wing & Conference Center of the **Kentucky Expo Center** directly next to the Louisville International Airport. This gorgeous, new location will continue to proudly show the best of the best that Army JROTC has to offer in an even more impressive venue. We congratulate all of the competitors on a job well done!

Air Force Nationals Across the Nation

Air Force cadets impressed in cities across the country.

Tadets shined in various regional events across the entire United States involving well over 2,000 AFJROTC cadets, each trying to gain top spots in their region as well as the ability to gain a premium competition spot to compete with the best of the best in blue for the overall Air Force Championships in Daytona Beach, Florida.

MID-VALLEY REGIONAL DAYTON. OHIO

Tom C. Clark HS from San Antonio, Texas traveled to Ohio and dominated both the Armed and the Unarmed divisions. Lowell HS from Massachusetts captured the Runner Up title in both divisions. Local school Lebanon HS who swept both divisions last year but ended up third overall is poised and ready to take the title back. They are currently planning to attend the Nationals in Daytona for the first time so we wish them well!

DEEP SOUTH REGIONAL MACON, GEORGIA

The Deep South Championships looked almost like a carbon copy of last year with the Dragons from Jefferson City HS in Jefferson, Georgia handily taking home the title in the Armed Division and East Paulding HS White Falcons from Dallas, Georgia capturing the title in the Unarmed Division. Their sister teams landed in the Runner Up position in both divisions: the East Paulding Blackhawks in Armed and Jefferson City Red Dragons in Unarmed. This year, SNI is working hard to provide a fantastic state competition for the AF drillers in Georgia. Stay tuned for details.

SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS

With many very strong teams that call the San Antonio area home, it looked from the beginning that it would be a fight between the local favorites, **John Jay**, **Brandeis**, and **Tom C. Clark High Schools** and that is exactly what happened. **John Jay** Silver Eagles

took first in every event in the Armed Division leaving no doubt that they deserved the championship title. **Brandeis** Nighthawks took the Runner Up spot with **Tom C. Clark** trailing very close at third overall. The Unarmed Division saw the **Brandeis** Blue Aces take three of the four events landing them in the Championship spot with **Tom C. Clark** Silver Valor taking the Runner Up title. **John Jay** SNAP II ended up third overall showing that it is very hard to top these local San Antonio teams.

FAR WEST REGIONAL LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

Hamilton HS from Chandler, Arizona took top AF honors in the Unarmed Division while Lancaster HS from Lancaster, California stood tall in the Armed Division. This unique event has a separate ROTC division so the cadets get a chance to watch performances by university teams from schools like Embry-Riddle Aeronautical, Brigham Young, Oregon State University and the University of Portland.

AIR FORCE JROTC NATIONAL DRILL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The top two teams from each division from all Regional competitions receive priority acceptance into the Nationals in Daytona Beach if they choose to attend. The top scoring Air Force JROTC teams are crowned the Air Force Nationals Champions in both the Armed and Unarmed Divisions. The Silver Valor from **Tom C. Clark HS** received the 2016 Air Force National Championship Unarmed Division and **John Jay HS** Silver Eagles powered their way to the 2016 Unarmed Division Championship.

We are currently looking for competitions in place that are Air Force exclusive or at least AFJROTC heavy in the Western part of the USA. If you attend or host one and you have solid units in your meet, contact us and tell us about it and maybe your meet can be designated an official Air Force Regional Championship in the future!



NAVY NATIONALS Academic, Athletic & Drill Championship



24 schools from 13 states across the nation descended on NAS Pensacola in an effort to best their competitors in an all-around fight for the elusive title of National Champion.

In the world of JROTC, the Navy Nationals is unique. It is truly a well-rounded demanding competition that engages the mind, body, and spirit of the young men and women that participate. A difficult 100-question exam challenges their Navy knowledge, an exhaustive inspection of every participant challenges their bearing, athletic events challenge their athletic prowess and commitment, and exacting drill & ceremony events challenge their precision and teamwork. To win the overall National Championship title is the dream of every

school that attends, but there can only be one. This two-day competition begins with the Unit Personnel Inspection (UPI) which is the only event that includes every single cadet who all stand inspection and are judged by Navy Recruit Division Commanders (RDCs) on their appearance, uniform, knowledge, and bearing. Although winning this single event will not guarantee a team's success at taking home the overall title, it can certainly be said that placing poorly can keep you out of the running. There were only 14 points out of 1500 separating the top five but Green Run HS from Virginia Beach, VA held the lead

taking home first place in UPI. After inspection, normally the cadets move outside to the base parade field to compete in the athletic events. However, this year (for the first time in the history of the Navy Nationals) rain prevented the event from moving outdoors. Cadets competed in both Curl-ups and Push-ups utilizing mats in the AO Hangar but it was determined by NETC that the Oval and Shuttle Relays would be dropped from the competition. The cadets handled the change in venue seamlessly giving their all as they took to the mats. The young men and women from Shawnee Mission North HS kicked butt and took names in both Curl-ups and Push-ups walking away with both first place trophies. It was no surprise that Shawnee Mission captured first place Overall Athletic followed by Green Run HS in second and Richland Northeast HS in third. After chow, 15 cadets from each school sit for the Academic Exam which has 90 questions pulled directly from the JROTC text books and 10 questions from current events. This historically grueling test was especially difficult this year with only 22.5% of the 360 students receiving a score of 60 or higher. The top score this year was 78 which was achieved by only two cadets, one from Boca Raton HS (Cadet Lax) and one from Green Run HS (Cadet Alexander). With tabulations complete, Boca Raton Community HS earned first place and had four of their cadets place in the top 10. Gaither HS from Tampa, FL had two of their cadets in the top 10 and the team took second place trailing Boca by only 14 points. The next morning, after a good night's sleep, the cadets arrive ready for a full day of drill & ceremony

events. Parents and supporters crowd the bleachers to watch these always entertaining events and with around 1800 cadets, instructors, and supporters in the building, the excitement in the air

is palpable. Teams will compete in both basic events (where they are given

> a sequence to perform) and exhibition events (where they create routine on their own limited only by their imagination) in both the Armed

and Unarmed categories. Shawnee Mission North HS was a force to be reckoned with as they captured first place in both

Armed and Unarmed Basic and with their first place in Color Guard it was enough to award them first

place Drill Overall even though they did not place in either exhibition event. Escambia HS grabbed second Drill Overall with top-five placements in all five events (2nd Armed Basic, CG, Armed Ex; 5th Unarmed Basic, Unarmed Ex) and Centennial HS took the third place Drill Overall with second in Unarmed Basic, third in Color Guard and fourth in Armed Basic and Armed Ex. At the awards ceremony in the beautiful National Naval Aviation Museum's atrium, Rear Adm. Stephen C. Evans, Commander, Naval Service Training Command was poised and ready to present the Navy Nationals Overall Trophies and after wearing a path to the stage eight times previously it was not a huge surprise that Shawnee Mission North HS had finally captured the National Title for the first time ever! Securing the Runner Up title was always strong Green Run HS. This incredible event could not happen without the support of the extremely knowledgeable judges from the Navy Recruit Division Commanders (RDCs) and Marine Corps drill instructors from Officer Training Command (OTC), Naval Station Newport, Rhode Island who annually support the event.




